

Inskip

Inskip was developed along a heavily traveled route used by miners and which eventually became a stage coach route in 1857. P.M. Kelly took interest and began to develop Inskip with a store and hotel. Inskip attracted so many miners and businesses that within a year many more stores, hotels, saloons, and other businesses flourished. Only the Inskip Hotel and a few smaller buildings remain of this once prosperous mining community. It was the Kelly & Company Hotel in 1866 when it was purchased by John Stokes who renamed it Stokes Hotel.
